Valdosta State University's IRB Definition of Research: VSU defines research as a systematic investigation, including research development, testing, and evaluation designed to develop or contribute to generalizable knowledge.

Private information includes information about behavior that occurs in a context in which an individual can reasonably expect that no observation or recording is taking place. Identifiable means that the identity of the participant may be ascertained by the investigator.

Incentives: Small monetary payments, gift cards, extra credit, etc. offered to encourage individuals to participate in a research study. The incentive amount should be based on the amount of time and effort being required of participants. The amount offered should never be so much as to create undue influence. Incentives must be provided to every individual approached about study participation, regardless of whether they choose to participate.
